
Besides, that's difficult. And takes a long time.

THE UKULELE

- Pronounced "ooo-koo-lay-lay"
- Developed in the 1880s by Portuguese immigrants living in Hawaii
- King Kalākaua (1836-1891) was a big fan of it and played himself
- Lore has it that the name is a loose translation of "jumping flea" or "my dog has fleas"
- Gained great popularity during the 50s due to the increased plastic manufacturing and the proliferation of Hawaiian culture through Hollywood
 - Tiny Tim
 - Elvis movies Blue Hawaii and Paradise, Hawaii Style
 - Surf culture

SIZES


- Soprano
 - Smallest
 - Sometimes Pineapple shaped
- Concert
- Tenor
- Baritone
 - Largest
 - Usually tuned differently





STANDARD TUNING

- G C E A
- <u>George</u> <u>C</u>looney <u>E</u>ats <u>Apples</u>
- "Re-entrant" tuning




WHAT IS A CHORD?

- A chord is 3 or more notes played at the same time (or in rapid succession as in strumming a uke).
- The wavelengths of the pitches meld together (harmonize) to create the unique sound of the chord
- 3 main types of chords:
 - Major Chords Happy, simple, cheerful, confident, bright, satisfying
 - Minor Chords Sad, serious, dark, sullen, apprehensive, melancholy, depressed, mysterious
 - Seventh (7th) Chords Jazzy, bluesy, romantic, serene, tranquil, exhilarant, strong, relentless, funky, soulful, moderate edginess
- All other chords can be generally classified as derivatives of these 3 types





READING CHORD DIAGRAMS



READING CHORD DIAGRAMS


- $\phi \rightarrow \text{Pointer Finger}$

- $\bullet \rightarrow \text{Unspecfied finger}$








C MAJOR CHORD








F MAJOR CHORD








G MAJOR CHORD
